Word Families Based on Common Words






This week, we are looking at spellings that belong to the same family of words. Knowing that a word follows a particular pattern, can make them simpler to spell.


Many words share the same origin* or root word.




*The word 'origin' means where something came from or where it began. The particular root words that we are going to look at this week are...
