Words with the Prefix 'auto-'










This week, we are going to look at adding the prefix **auto-** to words.

Working by itself, with little or no human control.


A device that focusses a camera for you.


An object that will spin because of a surrounding flow of moving air or water. For example: a propeller.


The words or script, often for a television programme, which the presenter reads as it scrolls down.


A factual account of somebody's life written by that person.

















Now it's your turn! Draw the spelling shape boxes for the 2 missing spelling words:

REMEMBER: Present perfect tense is used for activities that started in the past but are still true now, or have an effect on what is happening now

- Present perfect tense uses the verb HAVE before the main verb.
- Use 'have' for I / you / we / they.
- Use 'has' for he / she / it.

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
