



Maths: Using Positional Language

Home Learning Challenge

Draw a bush in the middle of a piece of paper. Draw a lion next to the bush, a mouse underneath the bush, and a cheetah in front of the bush. Draw a zebra behind the bush (gou might just be able to see his tail poking out) and a parrot on top of the bush.

Ask an adult to hide a toy in your house. Ask questions to find out where it is, starting with the room it is in and then more specific questions, e.g. "Is it underneath something?" or "Is it behind something?" Then, you could hide the toy and they can ask the questions to find it.

Go on a walk and play a positions game with a friend or grown-up. Ask them to spot an object and you have to guess what it is. Ask them to give you clues to identify the object, e.g. "It is behind the fence." or "It is in front of the café."

Find an old box to play a 'What's in the Box?' game. Place your favourite toy inside the box. Ask a friend to rattle the box and guess what is hiding inside. You could play this game with different objects or toys.

Activity Ideas


- Use different commands to instruct children how to move around the 'pirate ship (the hall).

Port	Run to the left of the hall.		
Starboard	Run to the right of the half.		
Bow	Run to the front of the hall.		
Stern	Run to the back of the hall.		
Man the lifeboats + a number	Get into groups of that number and row the lifeboat.		
Scrub the decks	Get down on all fours and pretend to scrub.		
Climb the rigging	Pretend to climb a rope ladder.		
Walk the plank	Walk in a straight line with one foot in front of the other and arms out to the sides (on the ground or along benches).		
Rats on board	Sit on the floor with feet raised off the ground.		
Stormy seas	Move around, swaying and wobbling.		
Land ahoy + a direction	Walk in that direction, looking intently.		
Main deck	Form a line in front of the captain, as quickly as possible.



Listen to the story of 'The Pirate Tree'



Sam is a fearless captain, who plays all day on the tree at the top of the hill. It turns into a pirate ship under her command, and she sails the world alone. One day, a boy approaches and he reckons Sam would do a better job of exploring if he had a partner. This story looks at the compromise and sharing element which make up a friendship. Specifically, it looks at how the knowledge and ideas of two people can change a game or a story to make it better. At first, Sam isn't convinced about playing with a newcomer, but when Agu tells his stories, Sam realises there are whole other adventures to be had when you listen to different people.

Explain that sharing and listening to our friends is important. Sam could have kept the Pirate Tree all to herself, but she would have missed out on all those new games. We might love a toy or make-believe, but by opening it up to others and sharing we will gain more from it.
